The following information was provided by Ball State University, Indiana University and Purdue University.

Type and Citation: Individual. Individual state institutions determine policies for resident student status.

Requirements for Resident Classification: To qualify as a resident student for fee purposes at the institutions surveyed in Indiana, an individual must reside there for twelve continuous months prior to the first day of classes. However, an individual's presence in Indiana for the main purpose of attending a college or university may not be counted in the 12-month period.

The residence of unemancipated minors follows that of their parents or legal guardians. Unemancipated minors are financially dependent upon their parents or other person(s) in authority, other than a spouse, for financial support. Indiana University uses the age of 21 or a financial dependency test to define an unemancipated minor for purposes of residency determination, although the age of majority is 18 years in Indiana. Guardians must have actual custody or administer the minor's property and provide any other necessary means of support.

Purdue University allows the residence of an unemancipated minor to follow that of a "natural" guardian, such as a grandparent, with whom the applicant has resided for at least 12 consecutive months and by whom the person has been supported for that same period if the person's parents are deceased or if the person has been abandoned with no legal guardian appointed.

If the parents are divorced or separated and either parent is an Indiana resident, the minor will be considered an Indiana resident as well.

Marriage does not confer residency status upon a nonresident spouse.

The foreign citizenship of a person shall not be a factor in determining resident student status if such person has legal capacity to remain permanently in the U.S.

Individuals once classified as residents are deemed to remain residents so long as remaining continuously enrolled until their degrees are obtained unless they remove their residency from the state.

Evidence of Domicile, Including but not Limited to: the residence of a student's parent or guardian; the source of the student's income; the state where taxes are paid; the state where the student's automobile is registered; the state issuing a student's driver's license; the state where a student is registered to vote; marriage of a student to an Indiana resident; property ownership in Indiana; the place of summer employment; admission of a student to a licensed profession in

Indiana; the student's future plans including committed place of future employment or studies; membership in civic and community organizations; home of record or Leave and Earnings Statement for military personnel; and address on visa for permanent resident aliens.

Fee Waivers and Waivers to Requirements: 1) U.S. military personnel: a) At Indiana University, military personnel on active duty are classified as nonresidents, but have the nonresident portion of their fees waived - this does not apply to their families; b) at Ball State U, members of the U.S. Armed Forces stationed on active duty in Indiana who enter the service from another state, their spouses and children, may enroll without the nonresident fee being assessed; and c) at Purdue U, military personnel on active duty in Indiana are classified as nonresident but have the opportunity to have the nonresident portion of their fees and tuition waived. 2) The 12-month requirement is waived at all three universities for students whose parents can clearly demonstrate that they have established residency in Indiana for reasons other than to qualify their children as residents for tuition purposes. 3) Ball State U grants resident classification to regular full-time faculty and staff and enrolled graduate and doctoral assistants, along with spouses and children residing with such persons.

Temporary Absence from the State: Individuals and their dependent children who have been domiciled in Indiana for at least 12 consecutive months immediately prior to leaving Indiana temporarily for reasons such as military assignment, employment (normally not to exceed 2 years according to Purdue regulations) or enrollment in an educational program (according to Indiana University) shall be eligible for resident classification, provided they have continually maintained their domicile in Indiana.
